SUMMER SPORTS CAMP IN TODWICK 2015

The Mega-Active Holiday programme came to Todwick again this year for four days from Tuesday 21st July to Friday 24th July. The weather was quite good and children attended from Todwick and surrounding villages. There was an increase in the numbers attending this year, although there were fewer girls than previously. There's no doubt that the new sports pavilion provides the camp organisers with far better facilities than before and the odd shower of rain can now easily be coped with.

Activities consist of a varied programme of sports and games, including football, hockey, cricket, tennis, kangoo boots (huge fun), dodge ball, rounders, basketball and to top off the week a frantic Water Fight (weather permitting). The main aim though is to provide children with a day of activity and lots of fun in complete safety. The attendance fee for the camps has remained at £5 per day or £2.50 a half day, whilst the costs of running the Camps has increased. Rotherham Local Plan: Publication of the Sites and Policies document

On **28 September 2015** RMBC published the Sites and Policies document and accompanying Policies Map for a six week consultation period. Also published is an Integrated Impact Assessment of the document, a Consultation Statement and other supporting material.

The Sites and Policies document earmarks specific sites for new homes, employment, shopping and other uses in Rotherham. These development sites are needed to deliver the targets for new homes and jobs set in the Local Plan Core Strategy, which was adopted in September 2014. The document also includes policies to guide decision making on individual planning applications.

The Sites and Policies document, an online version of the Policies Map and all other consultation material is available at <u>www.rotherham.gov.uk/localplan</u> The consultation documents are also available at Riverside House, Main Street, Rotherham S60 1AE and at all libraries in the borough during normal opening times.
