## **Todwick Parish Council budget (precept)**

You may have seen that many local authorities have been given licence to increase Council Tax by up to 1.95%. In addition 2% may be allowed to pay for increased child protection and adult care facilities. The precept that RMBC pay to Todwick is made up by a set amount and a grant. The value of the grant element has been reduced and to maintain the precept level the Parish Council has requested a small increase in the set amount. Effectively the Parish Precept will not increase.

# Spring clean and de-clutter?

On **March 18th** there will be a skip sited on the car park of the Recreation Ground. The skip will be manned, so that assistance can be provided with difficult items.
